
The Challenge


- 95% of new multifamily development from 2012-2016 in Atlanta is luxury housing
- Atlanta lost nearly 5,000 low-cost rentals from 2010 to 2013
- 55 affordable units available for every 100 Atlanta households with 50% or less AMI
- As rents increase, tenants migrate to lower tier communities reducing supply of affordable units




Enhancing the Solution

- Demonstrate success and replicate













Goals and Results


<u>Goal</u>: Open Doors will house 1,500 homeless individuals and families in the Atlanta metropolitan area over the next three years (2015 – 2017)

- 882 people housed through open doors in 2015
- 968 people housed over the last 12 months
- 726 housed so far in 2016 (September 2016)




